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PHASE I - Assessment

Phase I is an assessment designed to quickly estimate the range of potential credits available and the scope of work involved in quantifying and substantiating credit claims.

PHASE 2 - Implementation

If the Company decides to proceed with calculating and claiming credits, Phase II involves a deeper dive into the qualification and quantification of research and development activities and expenses.

The R&D Tax Credit:

- ➡ Is a hidden and immediate source of cash for many companies.
- ➡ Provides a reduction to current and future years federal and state tax liabilities.
- ➡ May be available for all open tax years, not just the current year (retroactive options differ depending on specific circumstances).
- ➡ May be carried forward up to twenty years for federal credits (state credits differ; CA credits never expire).
- ➡ Can be used by certain small businesses to offset up to \$500K/year of payroll tax liabilities.
- ➡ May also be available in states in which the company is taxed, in addition to earning federal credit on the same expenses.
- ➡ May be claimed on in-house and certain externally contracted research expenses.

Other R&D Tax Implications

Recent changes to tax law from the TCJA and OBBBA can complicate R&D tax matters. While taxpayers are once again permitted immediate deductions for domestic research expenses, foreign research expenses remain subject to capitalization. Taking best advantage of taxpayer-friendly provisions requires different approaches depending on the taxpayer's circumstances.

These activities may qualify:

- ➡ Development of new, improved, or more reliable products, processes, techniques, formulas
- ➡ Development of prototypes and models, including virtual models
- ➡ Design of tools, jigs, molds, and dies
- ➡ Development and testing of new technologies
- ➡ Attempting to use new materials
- ➡ Integration, design, or modification of new equipment
- ➡ Software development (includes internal software)
